Once she was running on the beach towards her family and a car was driving very fast towards her. If she had not followed her direction to “Down....Stay” , she would have been run over and wouldn’t be helping us here now.

What should responsible dog owners do to keep their dogs safe near traffic?

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Sometimes it’s hard to follow directions when we don’t know the reason why at the time. Can you think of an example when it’s important for you to follow directions to keep safe?

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Ruby was easily influenced and led by others she thought were ‘Cool’.

Why do you think she would do something that might harm herself – just because others were doing it?

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Can you think of a time when you were strong enough to say “No” to something that someone else wanted you to do?

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Saying she lost her homework isn't the only lie a dog can tell!

Sometimes when one member of her family gives her dinner she will go up to another member of the family and lick her lips and hit her food bowl with her paw. She does this because sometimes she gets another dinner by mistake!

Why would dogs tell lies?

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Can you think of a time when you were brave enough to tell the truth?

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Ruby believed in **GOOD FORTUNE** and she trusted someone who gave her some good advice.

What advice would you give someone who was thinking of having a dog?

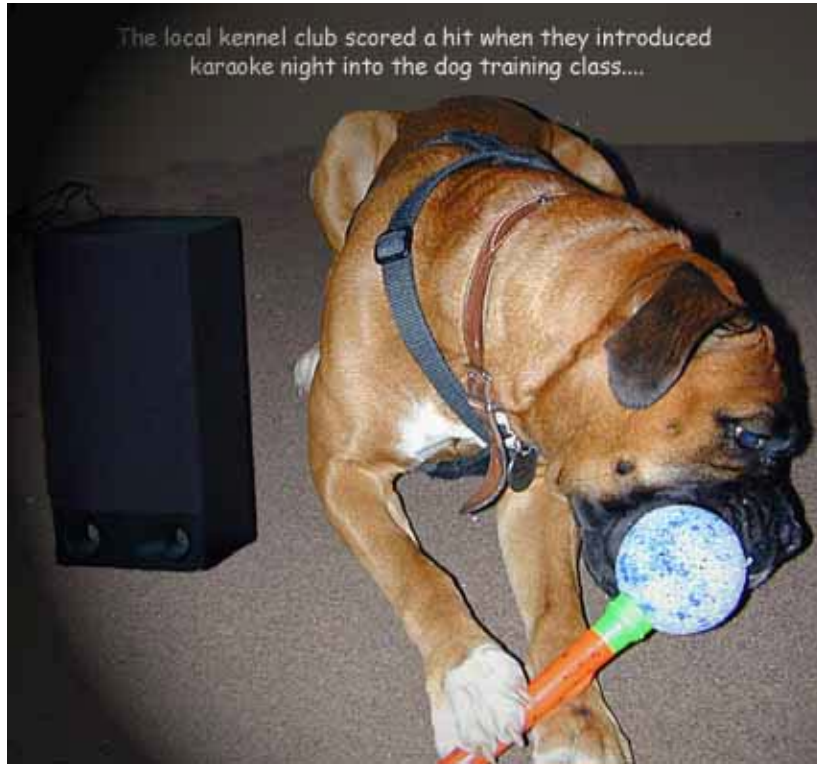
